The Master's degree "European and International Studies", "Middle East" Track, is a relocated degree from Sorbonne Nouvelle University in France. This two-year program is designed to provide in-depth training in the fields of international relations, European politics, international law, and global economics, with a particular focus on Middle Eastern affairs. Courses are primarily taught in French, with a substantial component in English, ensuring linguistic immersion in an international context. The program is open to graduates and professionals from all fields, fostering a diverse range of backgrounds and experiences.
